Personal History

Robert McEVOY was born at Horwich, Lancashire in 1894 the son of Walter James and Elizabeth McEVOY nee LINDSAY who were married 1880 at St. John the Baptist, Earleston.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 29, Webb Street, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 17. Loco Boiler Makers Apprentice

In the 1901 census the family were living at 24, Fairbank Street, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 7 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as an Apprentice

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Bolton. Lancashire. and embarked for Egypt on 25 September 1914. His last known address was Horwich, Webb Street, 22 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 September 1917 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
