Personal History

Vincent William McKIM was born at Stepney, Middlesex in 1897 the son of William Vincent and Theresa Josephine McKIM nee MARTELLI who were married 1893 at Pancras, London. His mother died in 1943.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 12, Brook Street, Woodlands, Oakenshaw, Near Bradford, Yorkshire,. He was aged 13

In the 1901 census the family were living at Gibralter,. He was aged 3 with the occupation of (Father in Army). Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Booking Clerk

Service History

He was living at Oakenshaw, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the Royal Garrison Artillery at Bradford, Yorkshire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 3 October 1917 in 35th General Hospita, France aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
