Personal History

George Edward Wilcock BARRETT was born at Halifax, Yorkshire in 1894 the son of William and Mary Lily BARRETT nee WILCOCK who were married 07/09/1895 at St. James, Halifax, Yorkshire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 4, York Street, Halifax, Yorkshire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Stableman.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 13, Beech Hill Terrace, Halifax, Yorkshire,. He was aged 6 He was a married man. His wife's name was Lillian BARRETT (nee DANETRY)

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Vanman

Service History

He was living at Halifax, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at the same place. He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 26 October 1917 in 11th General Hospital aged 23 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
