## Personal History

Frank MARTIN was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1893 the son of George Henry and Margaret MARTIN nee RIMMER who were married 04/06/1881 at West Derby Register Office or Registrar Attended . His mother died in 1947.

He was living at Aintree, Liverpool when he enlisted in the King's Liverpool Regiment at Bootle, Liverpool, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 7 March 1915. His last known address was Aintree, Liverpool, Greenwich Road, 39 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 16 May 1915 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
