Personal History

Laurence MARTINDALE was born at Adlington, Lancashire in 1896 the son of John and Martha MARTINDALE nee LILLY who were married 27/05/1895 at Christ Church, Adlington, Lancashire. His father died in 1944. His mother died in 1944.

In the 1911 census the family were living at Fenton Street, Mirfield, Yorkshire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Bolton Road, Duxbury, Chorley, Lancashire,. He was aged 5 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Lines Dept. at Mirfield as a Clerk

He enlisted in the West Riding Regiment.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 31 March 1918 aged 22

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
