Personal History

George BARROW was born at Salford, Lancashire on 25 February 1897 the son of William and Mary BARROW nee HYDE (NOW YOUNG) who were married 1896 at St. Simon, Salford.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 10, Cannon Street, Greengate, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Railwat Carters Boy.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Oldham as a Capstan Hooker

Service History

He was living at Salford, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 9 November 1915. His last known address was Salford, Cannon Street, 8 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 June 1916 aged 19

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
