Personal History

Albert MAYOR was born at Whitefield, Lancashire in 1888 the son of Richard and Martha MAYOR nee SCHOFIELD who were married 1887 at Bury Register Office or Registrar Attended . His father died in 1928. His mother died in 1928.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 27. Livesey Street, Whitefield, Lancashire,. He was aged 23 with the occupation of Railway Engine Cleaner.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 27. Livesey Street, Whitefield, Lancashire,. He was aged 12 He was a married man. His wife's name was Barbara MAYOR (nee GREENHALGH) They married at All Saints, Stand, Bury, Lancashire on 25 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Bury as a Fireman

Service History

He was living at Whitefield, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Middlesex Regiment (Army Service Corps) at Bury, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 27 July 1915. His last known address was Whitefiels, Wilton Street, 18 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 5 May 1918 aged 29

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
