Personal History

Fred MEADOWCROFT was born at Monton, Eccles, Lancashire in 1898 the son of John Thomas and Mary MEADOWCROFT nee LUNN who were married 1896 at Barton-on-Irwell, Register Office or Registrar Attended . His father died in 1945. His mother died in 1945.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 173, Monton Road, Monton, Eccles,. He was aged 13 with the occupation of Scholar.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 29, Parrin Lane, Monton, Eccles,. He was aged 3
Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Lines Dept. at Head Office as a Clerk

Service History

He was living at Monton, Eccles, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Royal Scots at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 8 January 1916. His last known address was Eccles, Monton, Vincent Avenue, 9 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 1 July 1916 aged 18 He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
