Personal History

Joseph METCALFE was born at Blackrod, Bolton, Lancashire on 19 August 1896 the son of James A. and Elizabeth METCALFE nee MONKS who were married 28/11/1889 at St. Katherine, Blackrod, Bolton, Lancashire. His father died in 1955. His mother died in 1955.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 190, New Street, Blackrod, Bolton, Lancs,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Croft Boy or Plater, Bleach Wks.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 176, New Street. Blackrod, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 4 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Labourer

Service History

He was living at Blackrod, Bolton, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Horwich, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 9 October 1915. His last known address was Blackrod, Bolton, New Street, 190 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 1 July 1916 aged 19

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
