Personal History

William Ernest MEYLER was born at Pembroke Dock, Wales in 1887 the son of William and Ellen MEYLER nee MASTERSON.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 15. School Lane, Freckleton, Near Kirkham, Lancashire,. He was aged 23 with the occupation of Railway Shipping Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 106, Lowndes Street, Preston, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 60, Berry Street, Preston,. He was aged 4 with the occupation of a Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie MEYLER (nee WRIGHT) They married at St. Paul, Farington, Preston, Lancashire on 30 March 1905

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Preston as a Clerk

Service History

He was living at Farington, Preston, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Preston. Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 3 February 1917 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
