Personal History

Frank MIDGLEY was born at Rochdale, Lancashire in 1896 the son of Joseph and Sarah Ann MIDGLEY nee BRIERLEY who were married 09/05/1891 at St. Chad, Rochdale, Lancashire. His father died in 1931. His mother died in 1931.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 70, Brierley Street, Fishpool, Bury, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Woollen Mule Piecer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 61, Manchester Road, Rochdale, Lancashire,. He was aged 7 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Bury as a Cleaner

Service History

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Bury, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 25/09.1914. His last known address was Bury, Brierley Street, 70 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 6 September 1917 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
