Personal History

Frederick George MILEHAM was born at Hull, Yorkshire on 16 November 1884 the son of George and Mary Ann MILEHAM nee CAVE who were married 1876 at St. Luke, Hull, Yorkshire. His father died on . In the 1911 census the family were living at Serving in India -. He was aged 26

In the 1901 census the family were living at Castle Howard Reformatory School, Bulmer, Welburn, Yorkshire,. He was aged 16 - Farm

In the 1891 census the family were living at 5, Ellis Terrace, Myton, Yorkshire. He was aged 6 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Laura MILEHAM (nee WISE). They had children: Ethel Majorie b. 1913

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Goole as a Reserve Shunter

Service History

He was living at Hull, Yorkshire when he enlisted in the Hussars at York, Yorkshire. on 16 March 1905 and embarked for France on 15 August 1914. His last known address was Bulmer, Welburn, Yorkshire, Castle Howard Reformatory School (1901 Census).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 24 August 1914 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal & British War Medal
