Personal History

Edward MILLER was born at Fleetwood, Lancashire in 1886 the son of Thomas and Jane MILLER nee MYERSCOUGH who were married 26/05/1864 at St. Mary, Lancaster. His father died in 1889. His mother died in 1889.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 29, Carlbad Street, Islington, London,. He was aged 24 with the occupation of G.V. Railway Policeman.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Headlands Farm, Cockerham, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Horseman on Farm.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 31. London Street, Thornton, Fleetwood, Lancashire,. He was aged 4

He was a married man. His wife's name was Eliza MILLER (nee GREGSON) They married at Christ Church, Glasson, Lancaster, Lancashire on 21 March 1905. They had children: Gilbert b. 1908, Thomas Edward b. 1910

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Lines Dept. at Wyre Dock as a Constable

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancaster Regiment at Lancaster, Lancashire. and embarked for (Theatre of war not known) on 23 August 1914. His last known address was Islington, London, Carlsbad Street, 29 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Died on 16 November 1914

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
