Personal History

Benjamin MILLWARD was born at Rhyl, Flint in 1884 the son of Ezra and Mary MILLWARD nee JONES who were married 1870 at St Asaph, Flintshire. His father died in 1900. His mother died in 1900.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 64, Roscoe Road, Carrington, Nottinghamshire,. He was aged 27 with the occupation of Railway Shunter (G.C.R).

In the 1901 census the family were living at 84 Millbank Lane Mountain View, Rhyl,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of General Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 88, Millbank Lane, Rhyl,. He was aged 7 with the occupation of Scholar.

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line at Miles Platting as a Shunter

Service History

He was living at St Asaph, Flint when he enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 20 October 1918 aged 34

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
