Personal History

Charles Napier M.M. & Bar MITCHELL was born at Liverpool, Lancashire on 18 June 1895 the son of Thomas Henry and Arabella Pascoe MITCHELL nee POOLE who were married 24/06/1888 at Our Lady & St. Nicholas & St. Anne, Liverpool. His father died in 1935. His mother died in 1935.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 2, Church Road, Seaforth, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Assistant Coal Dealer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 14, Henley Street, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 5

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line at Waterloo as a Porter

Service History

He was living at Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Kings Liverpool Regiment at the same place. on 12 November 1914

He is recorded as Killed in action on 21 August 1918 aged 23

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal , Military Medal and Bar
