Personal History

Edgar Stanley MORRIS was born at Liverpool, Lancashire in 1895 the son of William Henry and Elizabeth MORRIS nee HITCHCOCK who were married 01/08/1893 at St. Jude, West Derby, Liverpool, Lancashire.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 68, Queens Drive, Walton, Liverpool, Lancashire. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Railway Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 45, Keble Road, Bootle, Liverpool,. He was aged 5

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Manages Dept at Liverpool Bixteth Street as a Clerk

He was living at Wlton, Liverpool, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Kings Liverpool Regiment at Liverpool, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 2 August 1918 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
