Personal History

James Herbert MORRIS was born at Horwich, Lancashire in 1895 the son of Joseph and Annie MORRIS nee WRIGHT who were married 1893 at Bolton Register Office or Registrar Attended.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 31, Canada Street, Horwich, Bolton, Lancashire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Apprentice Rivetter Railway.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 16, Aurumn Street, Horwich, Bolton,. He was aged 6

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company at Horwich as an Apprentice

Service History

He was living at Horwich, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Loyal North Lancashire Regiment at the same place. on 30 May 1911 and embarked for France on 4 May 1915. His last known address was Bolton, Horwich, Dickenson Street, East, 4 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 15 June 1915 aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
