Personal History

John MULCAHY was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1882 the son of Jeremiah and Rose MULCAHY nee CLAYTON who were married 1880 at Manchester Register Office or Registrar Attended .

In the 1891 census the family were living at 1, Blackburn Street, Manchester,. He was aged 9

He was a married man. His wife's name was Elizabeth MULCAHY (nee RYAN) They married at St. Paul, New Cross, Manchester. on 5 July 1913. They had children: Mary A. b. 1914

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Miles Platting as a Ballastman

Service History

He enlisted in the King's Own Royal Lancashire Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 9 November 1914. His last known address was Manchester, Rochdale Road, Tudor Street, 13 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 1 May 1915 aged 33

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 14 Star
