Personal History

Frank MUNDY was born at Goole, Yorkshire in 1893 the son of Fred and Amelia MUNDY nee REVELL who were married 26/04/1885 at St. John the Baptist, Halifax, Yorkshire. His mother died in 1940.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 47, Malbro Avenue, Pasture Road, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 18 with the occupation of Plumbers Apprenrice.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 36, Fifth Street, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 7

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Goole Steam Shipping at Goole as a Labourer

Service History

He enlisted in the Yorkshire Light Infantry at Goole, Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 21 May 1915. His last known address was Goole, Carter Street, 62 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of natural causes on 10 October 1917 aged 24

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
