Personal History

James Patrick MURPHY was born at Liverpool, Lancashire on 27 August 1880 the son of James and Mary Ellen MURPHY nee DODD who were married 05/11/1878 at West Deby Register Office or Registrar Attended. His father died in 1890. His mother died in 1890.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 25, Ken Street, Litherland, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 31 with the occupation of Railway shunter, Pointsman.

In the 1901 census the family were living at Pepper Mill Street, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 20 with the occupation of Breadmaker.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 12, Greenland Street, Liverpool, Lancashire,. He was aged 10 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Anna MURPHY (nee COLLINS) They married at Liverpool Register Office or Registrar Attended on 20 March 1905. They had children: James b. 1906, Thomas Gerald b.1910, Daniel Gabriel b.1912, Francis Michael b.1914

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Lines Dept. at Aintree (Sorting Sidings) as a Foreman Shunter

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Liverpool. Lancashire. and embarked for France on 28 November 1915. His last known address was Walton, Liverpool, Maria Road, 49 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 15 May 1918 aged 38

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
