Personal History

Arnold Kime NEEDHAM was born at Barlborough, Derbyshire on 6 February 1895 the son of William and Eliza Ann NEEDHAM nee BRATLEY who were married 11/09/1884 at Barlborough, Derbyshire. His mother died in 1935.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 68, Manuel Street, Goole, Yorkshire,. He was aged 16 with the occupation of Railway Goods Checker.

In the 1901 census the family were living at High Street, Barlborough, Derbyshire,. He was aged 6 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Yorkshire Hussars at Goole. Yorkshire. and embarked for France on 29 July 1915. His last known address was Goole, Manuel Street, 68 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 16 December 1915 in 8th Casualty Clearing Station aged 20 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
