James Edward NOLAN was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1891 the son of John and Catherine NOLAN. He was a married man. His wife's name was Mary NOLAN (nee JOHNSON) They married at St. Aloysius, Manchester, Lancashire on 17 November 1913. They had children: John b. 03/05/1914 Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Oldham Road as a Porter

Service History

He enlisted in the Royal Field Artillery at Manchester, Lancashire. on 02.09/1914 and embarked for France on 16 January 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Fairfield Road, Hoyle Street, 82 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 23 October 1918

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
