Personal History

Charles Edward NUTTALL was born at Tottingto, Bury, Lancashire in 1884 the son of James and Eliza Ann NUTTALL nee ROWLAND.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 29, Wash Lane, Bury, Lancashire,. He was aged 23 with the occupation of Bleacher at Bleach Works.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 23, Kirklees Street, Tottington, Bury, Lancashire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Labourer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 27, Kirklees Street, Tottington, Bury, Lancashire,. He was aged 7 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Eliza Ann NUTTALL (nee BUCKLEY) They married at St. Paul, Bury, Lancashire on 7 September 1907. They had children: John Henry b. 1908

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Goods Managers Dept. at Bury as a Shunter

He enlisted in the Royal Engineers at Bury, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 25 April 1918 in 22nd Casualty Clearing Station aged 34 He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
