Personal History

James NUTTALL was born at Bardsley, Oldham, Lancashire on 9 January 1880 the son of Thomas and Sarah NUTTALL.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 196, Lee Street, Oldham,. He was aged 31 with the occupation of Cotton Spinner.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 5, Derby Place, Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 21 with the occupation of Cotton Piecer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 301, Oldham Street, Ashton Under Lyne, Lancashire,. He was aged 11 with the occupation of Cotton Piecer.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Sarah Ann NUTTALL (nee YATES) They married at St. Paul, Oldham, Lancashire on 8 December 1900

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Chief Civil Engineers Dept. at Oldham (Mumps) as a Plate Layer

Service History

He was living at Oldham, Lancashire when he enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Oldham, Lancshire. on 12 June 1915 and embarked for France on 9 November 1915. His last known address was Oldham, Webster Street, 55 (CWGC).

He is recorded as Died of Wounds on 13 January 1917 aged 37

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
