Personal History

Frederick Samuel OLIVER was born at Manchester, Lancashire in 1896 the son of Juan Samuel and Cecile Maude OLIVER nee STOTT who were married 19/01/1890 at Holy Trinity, South Shore, Blackpool, Lancashire. His father died in 1930. His mother died in 1930.

In the 1911 census the family were living at 33, Greenhill Street, Cheetham Hill, Manchester, Lancs,. He was aged 15 with the occupation of Assistant Clerk.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 10, Lambeth Street, Manchester,. He was aged 5

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Superintendent of the Line at Head Office as a Clerk

Service History

He enlisted in the Manchester Regiment at Manchester, Lancashire. on 4 September 1914 and embarked for France on 18 November 1915. His last known address was Manchester, Cheetham Hill, Greenhill Street, 33 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 30 July 1916 aged 20

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
