***Personal History***

*Harry PALMER was born in 1894 the son of Frank and Esther PALMER nee KNOX who were married 1890 at St. Barnabas, Crewwe. His father died in 1950. His mother died in 1950.*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Briscall as a Slotter*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the Machine Gun Corps at Horwich, Lancashire. and embarked for France on 4 May 1915. His last known address was Horwich, Smeaton Street, 14 (CWGC).*

*He is recorded as Killed in action on 11 April 1918 aged 24*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star*
