*Killed in action 3 October 1918 aged 24*

*Buried Prospect Hill Cemetery, France Grave III. A. 14*

***Personal History***

*Stewart Leslie Keppel PALMER was born at Haverford West, Pembrokeshire in 1894 the son of Llewelin and Evelyn PALMER nee SMITH who were married 1886 at Bramford, Middlesex.*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 83, Victoria Road, Horwich, Lancashire,. He was aged 17 with the occupation of Railway Apprentice Fitter.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at High Street North Side, Haverford, Pembrokeshire, Wales,. He was aged 7*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Horwich as a Premium Apprentice*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the Light Tank Corps. and embarked for France on 25 September 1916. His last known address was Horwich, Victoria Road. 83 (1911 Census).*

*He is recorded as Killed in action on 3 October 1918 aged 24*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & Military Cross*
