Personal History

Albert Henry PARK was born at Oldham, Lancashire in 1886 the son of David Nixon and Mary Ann PARK nee DRIVER who were married 30/01/1871 at Holy Trinity, Colhurst, Oldham, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 2, Station Street, Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 24 with the occupation of Cotton Mule Piecer.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 4, May Street, Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Cotton Piecer.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 391, Greenacres Road, Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 4 He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie PARK (nee CORBITT) They married at St. James, Oldham, Lancashire on 23 March 1905. They had children: Eva b.1909

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Stores Dept. at Castleton as a Labourer

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Bury, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action on 17 November 1917 aged 30

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
