***Personal History***

*Albert Henry PARK was born at Oldham, Lancashire in 1886 the son of David Nixon and Mary Ann PARK nee DRIVER who were married 30/01/1871 at Holy Trinity, Colhurst, Oldham, Lancashire. His father died on .*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 2, Station Street, Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 24 with the occupation of Cotton Mule Piecer.*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 4, May Street, Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 14 with the occupation of Cotton Piecer.*

*In the 1891 census the family were living at 391, Greenacres Road, Oldham, Lancashire,. He was aged 4 He was a married man. His wife's name was Annie PARK (nee CORBITT) They married at St. James, Oldham, Lancashire on 23 March 1905. They had children: Eva b.1909*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Stores Dept. at Castleton as a Labourer*

***Service History***

*He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Bury, Lancashire.*

*He is recorded as Killed in action on 17 November 1917 aged 30*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal*
