Personal History

Frederick PARKER was born at Miles Platting, Manchester in 1894 the son of Walter and Mary PARKER nee POWELL who were married 10/06/1893 at St. Clement, Longsight, Manchester, Lancashire. His father died on .

In the 1911 census the family were living at 15, Herbert Street, Newton Heath, Manchester,. He was aged 17. Railway Booking Clerk

In the 1901 census the family were living at 30. Melrose Street, Miles Platting, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 7

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Newton Heath as a Cleaner

Service History

He was living at Manchester, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Own Scottish Borderers at the same place. and embarked for France on 9 July 1915. His last known address was Newton Heath, Manchester, Herbert Street, 15 (1911 Census).

He is recorded as Killed in action on 25 September 1916 aged 21

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star
