*15469 7th Battalion King's Own Scottish Borderers*

*Killed in action 25 September 1916 aged 21*

*Commemorated Loos Memorial, France Panels 53 to 56*

***Personal History***

*Frederick PARKER was born at Miles Platting, Manchester in 1894 the son of Walter and Mary PARKER nee POWELL who were married 10/06/1893 at St. Clement, Longsight, Manchester, Lancashire. His father died on .*

*In the 1911 census the family were living at 15, Herbert Street, Newton Heath, Manchester,. He was aged 17. Railway Booking Clerk*

*In the 1901 census the family were living at 30. Melrose Street, Miles Platting, Manchester, Lancashire,. He was aged 7*

*Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Newton Heath as a Cleaner*

***Service History***

*He was living at Manchester, Lancashire when he enlisted in the King's Own Scottish Borderers at the same place. and embarked for France on 9 July 1915. His last known address was Newton Heath, Manchester, Herbert Street, 15 (1911 Census).*

*He is recorded as Killed in action on 25 September 1916 aged 21*

*He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal & 1914-15 Star*
