Personal History

Joseph PARKES was born at Pendleton, Manchester, Lancashire on 10 June 1881 the son of Jesse and Alice PARKES nee HOOD who were married 16/12/1877 at St. Matthews, Manchester, Lancashire. His father died on 17 September 1888. His mother died on 17 September 1888.

In the 1901 census the family were living at 10, Birley Street, Pendleton, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 19 with the occupation of No Occupation.

In the 1891 census the family were living at 10, Seiver Street, Pendleton, Salford, Lancashire,. He was aged 9 with the occupation of Scholar.

He was a married man. His wife's name was Sarah Hannah PARKES (nee WEBSTER) They married at St. John, Manchester, Lancashire on 22 April 1904

Before enlisting he was employed by the Lancashire and Yorkshire Railway Company, Locomotive Dept. at Victoria as a Pumper

He enlisted in the Lancashire Fusiliers at Salford, Lancashire.

He is recorded as Killed in action aged 34

He was awarded the Victory Medal, British War Medal
