Also Edward Vigor Fox an Inhabitant of the said Manor for not attending to serve as a Juror of the said Court although duly summoned thereto Whereupon it is considered that the said Edward Vigor Fox be in Mercy.

At the Court held on the 3rd October, 1808, JOHN DRINKWATER, Esq., and PETER EWART, Esq., were nominated as Constables, but at the Court held on the 21st October they both refused to serve, and the former was fined £20 and the latter £100. (See p. 53). The Jury then nominated JAMES POTTER and JOHN TOUCHET in their places, but the former refused to serve and was fined £100. Finally, JOHN TOUCHET and JOHN LOMAX were elected and took the oaths to serve as Constables for this year. (See p. 54.) All the above fines were paid. (See p. 55.)
