In consequence of an abscess in the lungs, and great organic defect from his wounds, Barrett was discharged to pension aged 26, on 15th Jan 1816.</p> <p>He was described as being 5ft 11" tall, with brown hair, grey eyes and a fair complexion.</p> <p>There was also a 'Dennis Barrett' serving with the regiment at Waterloo; they both came from Oldham, both enlisted the same date, both were weavers and they were both aged nineteen on enlistment Possibly twins !!!</p> <p>(perhaps someone can verify this). Booth was severely wounded in the face at 'Quatra Bras' on 16th June 1815. He was discharged to pension on 3rd May 1816 ( probably because of his wounds ). He was described as being 5ft 10" tall, brown hair, grey eyes and a fresh complexion. In later years, Booth was residing in Oldham, where he died on 7th Sept.</p>

He enlisted into the 33rd foot at Dalkeith, Midlothian, on 8th Dec. 1813, aged 25, giving his trade at the time of enlistment as a 'weaver'. After Waterloo, Buckley saw service with the regiment in Jamaica, serving there from 31st Jan 1822 - 21st March 1830. He was discharged to pension aged 42, on 3rd Nov. 1830, having served 16 years 331 days with the colours. Due to an old arm fracture, causing weakness on his left arm, Dyson was discharged to a pension of 9d per day, aged 37, on 30th June 1819, having served 21 years 19 days with the regiment (1 year at 'under age'). He was described as being 5ft 8" tall, with light brown hair, grey eyes and a fresh complexion. In later years, Dyson fell upon hard times and was an inmate at the union workhouse, Lancashire. Farr returned to the Peninsula in time to participate at the 'Battle of Vittoria' on 21st June 1813, and the 'Battle of Toulouse' on 10th April 1814. He then served at Waterloo on 18th June 1815. He enlisted into the 15th hussars at Marlborough, Wiltshire, for unlimited service, on 11th July 1801, aged 18, giving his trade at the time of enlistment as a 'blanket weaver'. Freeman saw service with the regiment during the Corunna campaign of 1808 - 1809, where he was present at the battle of 'Sahagun' on 20th Dec. 1808. Freeman later returned to the peninsula and was present at two more major battles : 'Vittoria' on 21st June 1813 'Toulouse' on 10th April 1814. Freeman then served during the Waterloo campaign of 1815. He was serving with the regiment during the "Peterloo" riots of 1819 so was probably involved. Freeman was discharged to pension aged 39, at York on 20th Nov 1821, having served 20 years 133 days with the regiment. He was described as being 5ft 8" tall, with brown hair, grey eyes and a fair complexion. Freeman died at Exeter, aged 78, on 21st April 1861. WO97/50/64.

Prior to enlistment Hardy saw service with the regiment during the Peninsular War, as well as Waterloo. In March 1824, Hardy was tried by civil powers and convicted of 'unnatural' crime. (no details of this 'unnatural' crime are given). He was sentenced to 12 months hard labour and served from 27th March 1824 - 9th March 1825. Then following his release, Hardy was discharged to pension aged 43, on 19th April 1825. He was described as being 5ft 6" tall, dark brown hair, blue eyes and a brown complexion. Haywood saw service with the regiment during the Peninsular War, where he was present at the battle of 'Vittoria' on 21st June 1813. He then served in the Netherlands and finally Waterloo. Promoted to Corporal of Horse on 10th Aug. 1815. Troop Corporal Major on 1st Jan. 1831. Haywood was discharged to pension aged 47, on 27th Dec. 1836, but stayed on until 10th Jan. 1837, and, was subsequently appointed yeoman warder at the Tower of London. Hoare saw service with the regiment during the later stages of the Peninsular War and was present at the battle of 'Orthes' on 27th Feb 1814, where he received a gunshot wound to the left leg. Hoare recovered quickly, as he was present at the battle of 'Toulouse' on 10th April 1814 . He then served during the Waterloo campaign of 1815. In 1819, Hoare was present at the Peterloo Massacre on 16th Aug of that year. He married 'Jane Fisher' at St. Mary's Church, Bishophill Senior, York on 7th May 1822. Hoare was discharged to pension aged 31, in 1825, due to being kicked in the leg by a horse, on the wound he received at 'Orthes'. He had served 13 years with the regiment.
